Division of Elementary and Secondary Education – Office of Special Education Advisory Council for the Education of Children with Disabilities Grants and Data Management, April 2023

The Grants & Data staff continues to provide technical assistance to District, Charter, Education Service Cooperative (ESC), and State Agency personnel.

DESE-OSE has posted the FFY23 IDEA Grant Application for public comment.

Preliminary Budget Reports are currently being processed. The SPED finance team will review the budgets for approval of all special education funds. Preliminary Budget initial review is complete and working on corrections. 22-23 Special Education Discretionary Grants have been approved.

The High-Cost Occurrence registry has opened. Multiple TA sessions have been provided around the High-Cost submission and June 1 IDEA Part B application. We have revamped the June 1 IDEA Part B application to make the process more efficient and user friendly for LEAs. The office has created a Final Allocation worksheet that can act as a reference for all required special education finance amounts that will trigger non-compliance if incorrect.

Reimbursed \$120,330,096.34 IDEA Part B School Age 21-22 funds to districts for 21-22 expenditures and \$40,399,815.30 for 22-23 expenditures. Reimbursed \$14,223,460.58 ARP School Age 21-22 funds to districts.

Reimbursed IDEA Part B Section 619 Preschool 21-22 payments of \$5,371,724.11, \$2,339,483.59 of 22-23 funds, State Preschool Grant funds of \$10,138,752.00, & State EIDT Preschool funds of \$3,600,000.00, and \$2,369,484.81 of ARP EC funds to school districts and ESCs through August of 2022.

The Grants & Data Office continues to make monthly/periodic payments to districts/charters/coops/state agencies.
