To receive EIDT services, the child must have a documented disability or delay, as shown on the newly required annual comprehensive developmental evaluation. In addition to having a developmental disability or delay, the child must now have a documented need for at least one therapy. (Physical, Occupational, Speech, or Nursing Services)
