Division of Elementary and Secondary Education - Special Education Unit Advisory Council for the Education of Children with Disabilities Grants and Data Management, October 2019

The Grants & Data Staff continue to provide technical assistance to District, Charter, Education Service Cooperative (ESC), and State Agency personnel.

All Districts, Charter Schools, ESC Preschools, and State Agencies submitted applications in June and received approval for spending the 2019-20 funds.

Budget and Financial Report amendments are being processed and will be reviewed for approval by the SPED finance team. Cycle 9 financial reports were due to APSCN by August 31 and Cycle 1 budgets were due by September 30.

Catastrophic Guidelines are to be posted on the DESE website in November.

The finance staff sent \$983,534.00 to 102 school districts and ESCs for Extended School Year services, an increase of \$62,012.00 for 2018 ESY services.

Title VI-B funds, totaling \$19,121,689.81, were reimbursed to districts for 2018-19 expenditures.

The team reimbursed \$3,661,324.58 Title VI-B funds to districts for 2019-20 expenditures.

Title VI-B Section 619 Preschool payments of \$210,250.65 for the 2018-19 fiscal year as well State Preschool Grant totaling, \$1,411,441.65, were reimbursed to school districts and ESCs through September 31, 2019.

The office continues to send Title VI-B State Set-Aside funds to 15 ESCs and 6 agencies for Behavior Support Specialists, ESVI Consultants, Transition, SERC Consultants, and special programs grants. Co-ops are also receiving a small mentoring grant to enhance retention of special education teachers.

Two rounds of fiscal monitoring are being conducted this year, one per semester.
