

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### **Arkansas Transition Services**

### **CAYSI**

- The 2024 DeafBlind Child Count is underway. This federally mandated assessment allows CAYSI the opportunity to contact school districts regarding current students and potential referrals for the program.
  - The data collected each year guides the programming based on demographics of the students.
  - CAYSI anticipates that the number of students for the 2024 census to be 269 students across AR.
- CAYSI has a new MOU in place with the AR Department of Health, Infant Hearing program that will allow for referrals to CAYSI based on noted criteria collected during newborn hearing screenings.
  - Arkansas is the second state in the country to have this agreement in place and is on the forefront of a national effort between the Early Hearing Detection and Intervention (EHDI) and National Center on Deafblindness (NCDB) to collaborate for earlier identification.

### **Assessment and Curriculum**

- 1% Tiered Monitoring is ongoing with 58 districts and will continue through March.
- The Evaluation Discussion Group COP is in it's fourth year of meeting monthly, with around 70 attendees each month.
- MIDAS Grant work continues currently developing parent resources.
- Actively interviewing for two Program Advisor positions - one with a curriculum focus and one with a 1% focus.

## Early Childhood Special Education

- Kindergarten Transition sessions beginning this month to ensure both early childhood special education and school-age special education staff and leadership are prepared to ensure smooth transitions.
- Planning for the seamless merger of the early childhood inclusion project and tiered intervention projects into one project that with differentiated support for programs.
- Interviewing our second early childhood program advisory position.

# Grants & Data Management

- High Cost Occurrence
  - Increase in 200 students from last year
  - 180 LEAs
  - Submissions due March 18th
  - Increase in HCO State appropriation to \$17,500,000 from \$16,998,150
  - Multiple Zoom and in-person TA sessions being conducted to support LEAs
- Preparations have begun for FFY 25 IDEA Part B application
- Currently conducting Time Frame 2 Fiscal Monitoring
- Reviewing and approving preliminary allocations

# Monitoring & Program Effectiveness


- Timeframe 2 opened on January 13, 2025

- Actual: Exceeded Target 96%
